Course Objective

Gender and culture are present in all aspects of our lives.

This workshop endeavours to:

- examine how therapeutic conversations are influenced by gender and culture
- explore the effects of historical and cultural benefits of gendered ideas and practices; and how it shapes unequal distribution of privilege in our communities
- develop and support narrative skill development with structured exercises and discussions

Course Outline

- Deconstruction of gender and cultural discourses
- Exploring ideas and experiences central to meaning making and multi-storied accounts of identity
- Facilitating externalised conversations: move away from totalising language and deficit descriptions
- Working with the stance of resistance
- Collaborating to re-author alternative stories
- Promoting accountability and ethical therapeutic practices: navigating cultural and gender blindness
